# PACT -- Parent And Child Together

Our PACT Program is 'packed' full of learning & meaningful experiences together!

PACT is for those seeking a different type of involvement in Jewish learning and living as a family. It offers a one-day per week schedule for the children and more flexibility and choices in schedule for families.

The PACT Program includes these components:

## Fourth Grade PACT classes - Weekly afternoon classes (4:30-6:30 p.m.)

Students have a Hebrew Language Class and a Judaica Class by grade.

- Hebrew Language: letter recognition, decoding words, reading prayer book and holiday-related prayers and blessings
  - Judaica Class: Introduction to stories from the Torah; exploring God in our world
  - Individual Hebrew Language Tutorials (see below)

The PACT students also have music class and Worship assemblies with the other afternoon Religious School classes.

# Fifth Grade PACT classes - Weekly afternoon classes (4:30-6:30 p.m.)

Students have a Hebrew Language Class and a Judaica Class by grade.

- Hebrew Language: Shabbat prayers and blessings: meanings and mastery
- Judaica Class: the Jewish life-cycle and the land and State of Israel
- Individual Hebrew Language Tutorials (see below)

The PACT students also have music class and Worship assemblies with the other afternoon Religious School classes.

## Sixth Grade PACT classes - Weekly afternoon classes (4:30-6:30 p.m.)

Students have a Hebrew Language Class and a Judaica Class by grade.

- Hebrew Language: Chanting the prayers of Shabbat service
- Judaica Class: Jewish Heroes from Biblical times to present day
- Individual Hebrew Language Tutorials (see below)

The PACT students also have music class and Worship assemblies with the other Religious School classes.

## Individual Hebrew Language Tutorials

In addition to their weekly Tuesday or Wednesday afternoon class, each student has an individual 15-minute session with a Hebrew Language teacher. These are in-person, by phone or by Skype/Facetime; the schedule is set by the teacher and individual parents at the beginning of the school year.

<u>PACT REQUIREMENTS:</u> Families are expected to attend a total of eight of the Foundation programs and Family experiences throughout the year. They are generally offered on Sunday mornings (9:30–11:00 a.m.) and Tuesday and Wednesday evenings (6:30–7:45 p.m.). See below for separate Worship Service and Tzedakah requirements.

#### PACT Foundation Programs

Each year the Foundation Programs follow a theme. During these programs, parents and children learn together, participate in special events and have a chance to get to know other PACT families.

#### Acts of Tzedakah:

Each family participates in a Social Action project or program. These may be events held at Temple Beth David, such as making sandwiches for a local soup kitchen, or it may be a project in the community.

#### Worship Services:

Students & Parents are expected to attend the following number of <u>in-person</u> worship services during the school year: Fourth graders should attend eight services, Fifth and sixth graders should attend ten services. These services may include holiday, festival, B-mitzvah and Shabbat worship. Students who attend services at another temple should inform their teacher so that they may receive credit.
